- 2) must have had a well-established national or regionally-recognized patient care practice including referrals for interventional pulmonology service,
- 3) must have trained other physicians or surgeons in interventional procedures and related disease management,
- 4) must be or have been a leader in his/her own country and/or region,
- 5) must not have received the WABIP-Dumon Award and/or the Killian Medal,
- 6) should have practiced interventional pulmonology for at least 30 years since training,
- 7) should be an advocate for interventional pulmonology,
- 8) should have introduced or helped develop interventional techniques, and
- 9) may not necessarily be a WABIP member
